Definition

An "Insider" is a person who exploits, or has intention to exploit, their role for unauthorized purposes.



The Insider Threat

Risks arising from:

- employees working in or for the aviation sector
- whose roles provide them with privileged access to secured location or sensitive information
- who therefore have potential tactical advantage in perpetrating acts of unlawful interference.



Insider activities

- Espionage
- → Terrorism
- Security compromise
- Theft properties
- Sabotage
- Information theft



Methods of attack

- Sabotage or damage to assets or infrastructures
- Facilitation of unauthorized third-party access
- Unauthorized disclosure of data or information
- Theft or even financial corruption




Vulnerability to Insiders

- → Newcastle (UK) based BA employee was in contact with now-deceased AQ leader Anwar al Awlaki.
- → Offered to use his expertise as a software engineer to attack systems.

THE EMAIL EXCHANGE

JANUARY 2010, KARIM TO ANWAR AL-AWLAKI:

'It has been three years that I have been living here away from the company of good brothers and spending a good part of my day working with the kuffar (disbelievers or infidels). I was also keeping a low profile by hiding my real religious viewpoints, trimming my beard and not getting too involved in the local Muslim community or any Islamic

activities. But leading a life like that was really killing me inside. That's why I desperately want to make hijrah (fight Jihad). I personally know two brothers, one who works in baggage handling at Heathrow and another who works in airport security. Both are good practising brothers and sympathise.'

FEBRUARY 2010, AL-AWLAKI TO KARIM:

'Our highest priority is the U.S. Anything there, even on a smaller scale compared to what we may do in the UK would be our choice. So the question is with the people you have is it possible to get a package or a person with a package on board a flight heading to the U.S.?'

FEBRUARY 15, 2010, KARIM TO AL-AWLAKI:

'I have started working on the bros (brothers) I mentioned on the last letter without mentioning you directly. The bros responded better than I expected. Like you I also agree that U.S. is a better target than UK, but I do not know much about U.S. I car work with the bros to find out the possibilities of shipping a package to a U. S.-bound plane.'
